## NURSING PLEDGE

### CLARA BARTON SCHOOL OF NURSING

#### THE NURSES' SERVICE PLEDGE

I solemnly pledge myself before God and in the presence of this assembly, to practice my profession faithfully.

I declare that my ultimate responsibility as a nurse is to promote and safeguard the total wellbeing of my clients, their families and the community at large based on the concept of Primary Health Care.

My practice will be founded on respect for my clients' humanity, dignity and individuality.

I undertake to treat my clients equally and will not allow that social, economic, political, religious or cultural differences influence the care I render.

To fulfil the needs of my clients, I will endeavour to understand and address it with compassion and empathy.

I accept it as my duty to protect the interest of my clients and to maintain professional secrecy. I will comply with all moral, legal and professional standards in the execution of my duties and inspire others in achieving our shared vision.

Finally, I pledge to maintain the highest level of knowledge and skills; and to contribute towards the development of my profession through research and continuous professional development.





## THE MEANING OF THE LAMP IN THE PLEDGE OF SERVICE

The lamp in your hand is the symbol of those who keep vigil over the sick.

It is a symbol of the philosophy of the nursing profession; that those who nurse should be a light to others.

It is a beacon of comfort and kindness and gentleness and courage, and an unswerving devotion to caring for humanity.

It indicates that you are prepared to develop your profession and to practice it in the light of the sciences, which are the building blocks of medical and nursing sciences.

It confirms that you are prepared to carry out your professional acts in accordance with the legal and ethical codes of your profession, and that you are prepared to care for man in his uniqueness with knowledge and compassion.

It is the symbol that indicates that you are prepared to be the following for those who need your help:

- The eyes of the blind that are sick.
- The power of movement for those who cannot move (i.e. the unconscious and or injured individuals).
- The hands of those who do not have the strength to care for themselves.
- The comforter of those who are alone or are grieving.

## MEANING OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH EMBLEM

- Environmental Health is the profession that protects individuals and community wellness through health promotion activities and enforcement of acts and regulations. They assist in reducing the potential for hazardous environmental problems by researching, analyzing data, reporting and liaising with the health departments, the community and other professionals.
- Environmental Health Practitioner helps to reduce the incidence of communicable diseases and health hazards, performs technical assessment, provides consultative and educational services, and ensures the community development does not conflict with an unhealthy environment.
- The tap symbolizes monitoring quality of drinking water by sampling and inspecting water supplies to ensure that standards are met as prescribed by WHO.
- The insect symbolizes the controlling of vector-borne diseases. An EHP/A must have technical knowledge of application of entomological survey to identify the possibility of vectors in the areas and the used chemicals.
- The house symbolizes the importance of providing and suitable shelter and advising the provision of health housing structures.
- The fork & knife symbolizes the inspection of premises in order to reduce the potential for food-borne diseases. Evaluate and approve plans and specifications for new and or renovated food premises to ensure compliance with pertinent legislation.
- The pollution symbol symbolizes the control and prevention of pollution activities by reducing or eliminating the release of pollutants (contaminants, usually human-made) into the environment into the environment. It is regulated by various legislations that establish limits for the discharge of pollutants into the air, water and land.
- The radiation symbolizes the prevention and avoidable of radiation injury from radiation sources and to keep public, environmental and worker exposure to radiation-producing machines and radioactive materials to acceptable levels.
