To be the Center of Excellence in Health, Social and Management Sciences in Namibia and beyond.

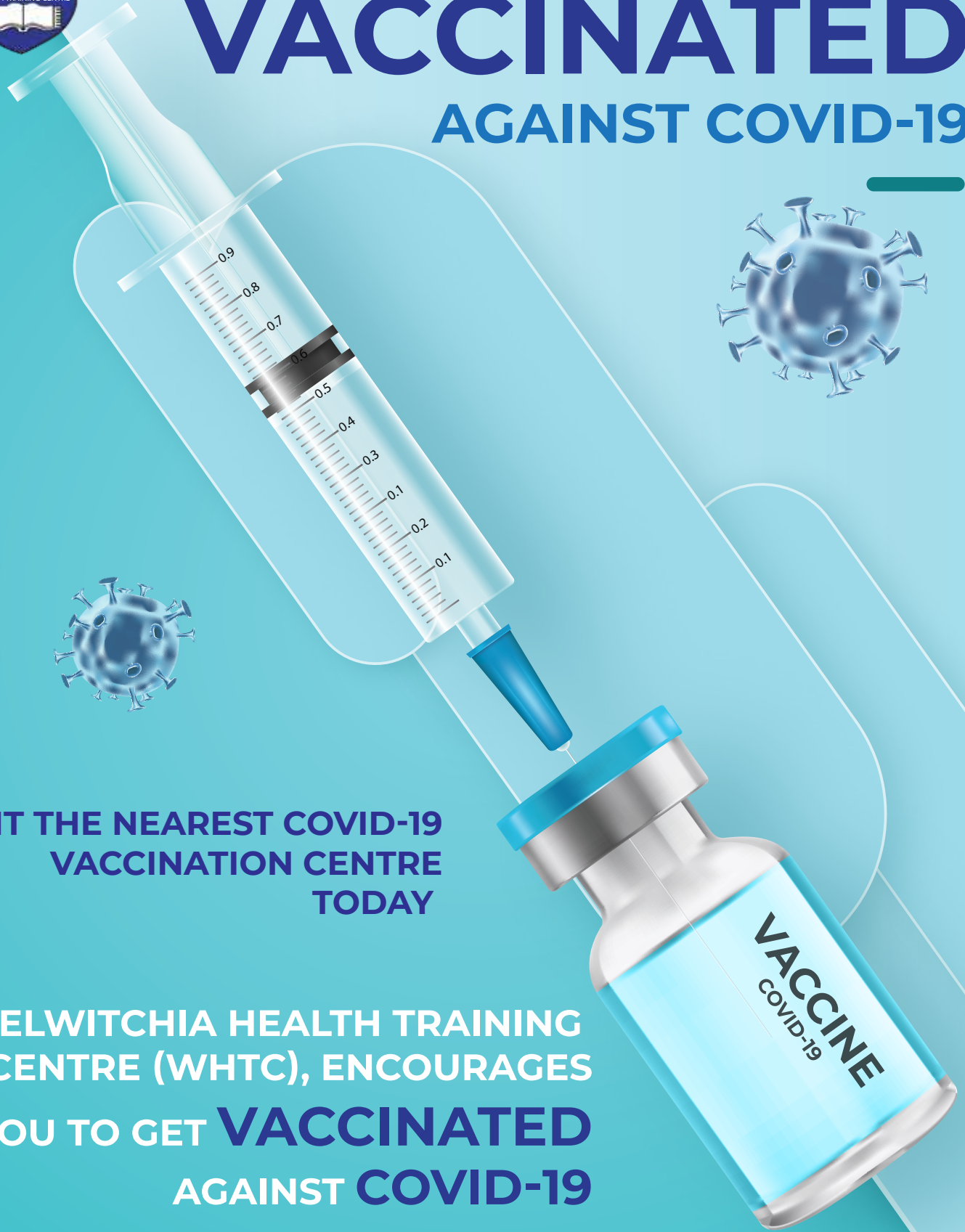

It confirms that you as professional nurses are prepared to submit to the discipline of your profession.

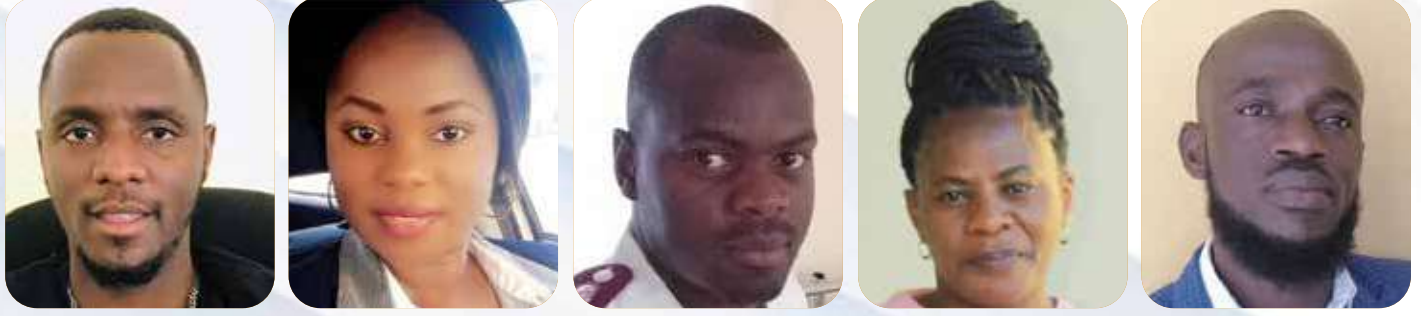
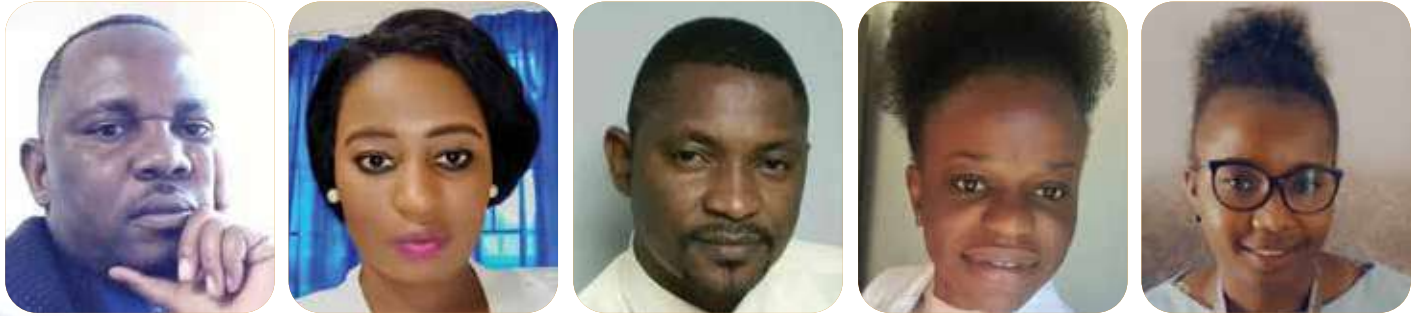
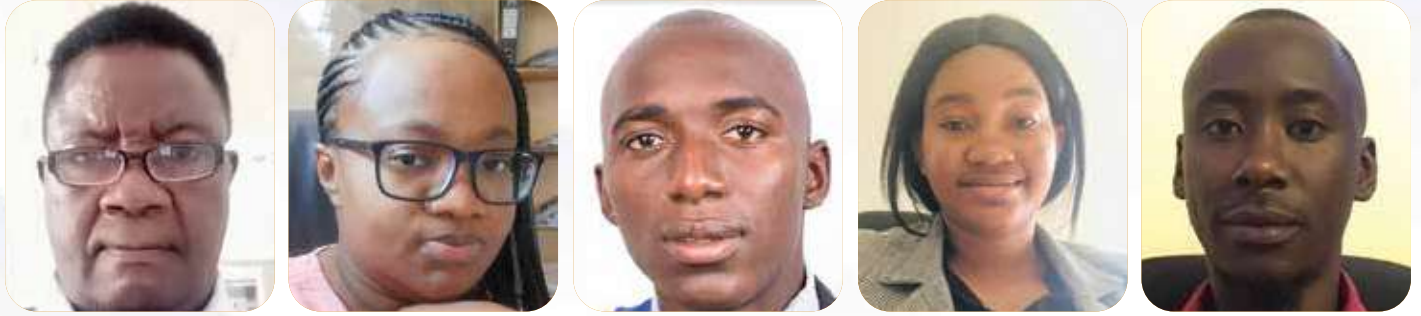
